

WHAT TO EXPECT AT THE POLLS



Follow these steps when you arrive at your Polling Place during Early Voting or on Election Day. Ask a clerk for assistance if needed.

1. CHECK-IN

Voters must present valid ID with a photo and signature. After verification, voters will sign the Electronic Pollbook and then receive a Voter Pass.



2. BALLOT TABLE

In exchange for their Voter Pass, voters will be provided a paper ballot and privacy folder.



3. PRIVACY BOOTHS

In a booth that provides privacy for the voter, voters will make their selections on both sides of the ballot page(s) with ink pen provided in the booth. Voters may use sample ballots filled out at home for reference.



4. OPTICAL SCAN VOTING EQUIPMENT

Voters take their ballot inside a privacy folder to the poll worker. Voters then insert the ballot, one page at a time, into the optical scanner in order to cast their ballot. If a mistake is made, the voter may ask a clerk for a new ballot.



ACCESSIBLE VOTING

Each Polling Place will have an ADA compliant voting machine equipped with an accessible controller and earphones through which voters can customize and are talked through the voting process. Voters may also plug in a sip/puff device or paddle input device.



WHAT TO BRING TO THE POLLS



ID NEEDED TO VOTE

In-person voting in Florida requires valid ID containing a photo and signature. The photo and signature can come from one ID or a combination of IDs from the following list:

- Florida Drivers License or Florida ID (as issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles)
- United States Passport
- Debit or Credit Card
- Military ID
- Student ID
- Retirement Center ID
- Neighborhood Association ID
- Public Assistance ID
- Veteran Health ID issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs
- A Concealed Weapon/Firearm License issued pursuant to §790.06, F.S.
- Employee ID issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE ID?

If you are not able to produce proper ID, you will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot. A Provisional Ballot is used when an individual's voter eligibility is uncertain. It allows the Supervisor of Elections office to research the matter and determine if the person is eligible. Voters may track the status of their Provisional Ballot at LeonVotes.org or by calling our office at (850) 606-8683.

Provisional Ballot voters must submit any eligibility documentation to the Supervisor of Elections office no later than 5pm on the second day following Election Day.
